### Costs of Ministry and Work Teams — Update

A double whammy of inflation and exchange rate shift have led to increased costs of operating the student houses and of items for work team projects in villages. The cost per student per month in the student houses is now about \$200 (up from \$140). For a specific example, the price of the high-quality hammock for each work team member has increased from 650 pesos several years ago to 1150 pesos today. Work team leaders can help by increasing the Accion fee to \$600 per par-

ticipant, from our current requirement of \$550. Oscar, Roger, and the board will reconsider this fee in early 2024, although we will honor \$550 if previously publicized in recruitment.

Work team leaders should also be aware that most teams purchase several \$40 fans in Mexico for lodging areas and donate them to their hosts. This past summer Accion arranged for locals to safely prepare meals for most of the work team dinners at \$15 per person per

meal. Teams thought this new option went very well and enthusiastically supported the idea.



The bottom line is that FOA really appreciates the generous gifts that support this ministry and donations that can help provide for the future.

## Success at CEM, Changes at VIM

Both Merida Student Houses (CEM) are going strong with university students. Ten young women are studying mostly chemistry and health fields, with

some business and architecture. Twelve young men are studying fields mostly related to engineering and education, plus nutrition, agronomy, and accounting.

The Mayan Children's Village (VIM) continues to provide access to quality high school education, now helping day students in addition to those staying overnight during the week. Mexico has expanded the use of television to provide middle and high school instruction. Some rural students find this sufficient and are not coming to VIM. But to be college-ready, students need to attend the quality in-person high school education and need VIM for meals and study including internet access. VIM provides a safe place outside the city of Ignacio Zaragosa that has experienced growth, almost like a wild west gold rush, due to the Mayan Train railway construction including a station at nearby Nuevo Xcán.
